*For the economy, recycling:*

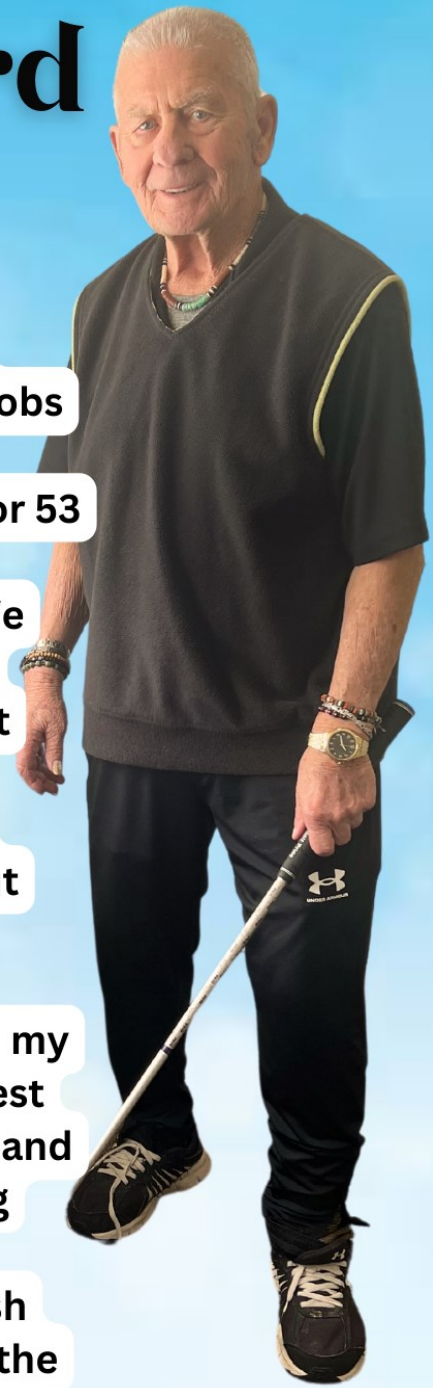
- Increases economic security by tapping a domestic source of materials.
